The two great French Romantic painters, Eugene Delacroix and Theodore Gericault, seized on the Tumultuous and the Exotic, a new trend in France. As such they waged war on the Neo-Classicists (Ingres and David), on the battleground of the Salon, arriving via the Revolution at the revolution which was Impressionism. We also look at the scintillating pictures of Caspar David Friedrich and his personal brand of Northern Soul.

Among the welter of philosophers and thinkers, who include many of world stature (Adam Smith, Thomas Carlyle, David Hume), writers (James Boswell, Robert Burns, James MacPherson- whose Ossian Cycle had a huge success around Europe) and engineers (James Watt, Thomas Telford), the Scottish Enlightenment included a great number of celebrated and influential Painters, Sculptors and Printmakers. Of these the Neo-Classicist Gavin Hamilton, the Topographer Paul Sandby the satirist James Gillray, and the portraitists David Allan, Allan Ramsay and Henry Raeburn, are particularly notable and the chief subjects of this enquiry.

The Victorians

The status of Britain in the world today is largely the creation of the Victorian imagination and the success of its ideas and developments. This lecture documents the many styles of painting which describe this Arc of Invention, including the Victorian Olympians, the Pre-Raphaelites, the Arts and Crafts Movement, the Aesthetic Movement and Symbolism, Narrative and Genre painting, and society Portraiture. Featured artists include Lord Leighton, Dante Gabriel Rossetti, Edward Burne-Jones, G.F.Watts, Richard Dadd, Luke Fildes, Lawrence Alma-Tadema, James Abbott MacNeill Whistler, John Singer Sargent and many more.

Adrian Sumner - A Biography



A graduate of Liverpool College of Art, Adrian has worked as an Illustrator, Arts Development Officer and Lecturer in various academic and public institutions. He has been Arts Development Officer for Chester City Council, then Cheshire West and Chester Council, with a particular interest in Visual Art.

He has lectured in the History of Art for the University of Liverpool and a variety of groups and societies, to many thousands of people over a period of thirty five years. Recent developments have included lecture tours to Paris, Glasgow, Prague, Amsterdam, Edinburgh, Florence, Pisa, Siena, Bruges, New York, Madrid, Ekaterinburg Cologne and many English cities. Specialist subjects include Art Deco, Flemish Art, Art Nouveau, Mannerism and the Modern Movement.

His painting is figurative and highly detailed, drawing its inspiration from many periods of history and many artistic sources. It is mythological, symbolic, exotic, erotic, arcane, literary, whimsical, ancient and modern. It refers to games, puns, magic, alchemy, physics, poetry, dreams and visions.
